KEY TERM: Canon – The list of all the books that belong in the Bible.

KEY CONCEPT: The OT was already recognized as a ______ before the NT was written.

The following are seven reasons the Old Testament is the Word of God.

- 1. God _____.
 - The Ten Commandments: "And the tables were the work of God, and *the writing was the writing of God* graven upon the tables" (Ex. 32:16; cf. Deut. 4:13; 10:4).

2. God ______ through others.

 Moses wrote additional words (Deut 31:24-26); Joshua "wrote these words" (Josh 24:26); Samuel, David, Jeremiah, Isaiah, Daniel, Ezra, etc. were all used by God to compose His Holy Word.

3. God ______ over a period of time, then stopped.

- The content grew until the time of the end of the writing process.
 - After 435 BC, there were no further additions to the OT canon.
- 4. _____ recognizes it.
 - "God says" & "Scripture says" are used interchangeably.
 o Rom 9:15, 17 quotes Exod 33:19, 9:16.

5. The ______ stands as a witness to it.

- 3-fold division in Lk 24:44: "Law of Moses, and the Prophets, and the Psalms."
 - i. Jesus references the beginning of OT Scripture to its end (Matt 23:35).
 - ii. Jesus and NT authors quote various parts of the OT as divinely authoritative over 295 times!
 - iii. New Testament authors cited the OT as "Scripture."

- 6. _____ recognized it.
 - Josephus (37 AD *c*.100) A Roman Historian: Head of Jewish forces in Galilee fighting against Rome.
 - Philo (20 BC 50 AD) Jewish philosopher. A contemporary to Jesus and the Apostles.

7. The ______ confirm what was known.

- 981 texts were discovered in 11 caves between 1946-1956.
- Cites a three-fold division of the OT: "The Law, the Prophets, and David" 4QMMT
